

1. Installation

1.1 WordPress Installation

This theme requires a working version of WordPress to be installed on your server. You should always run the latest version of WordPress. If you don't have a WordPress installed on your server, please follow the steps below to install it:

Step 1 - Go to WordPress.org and download the latest version of WordPress.

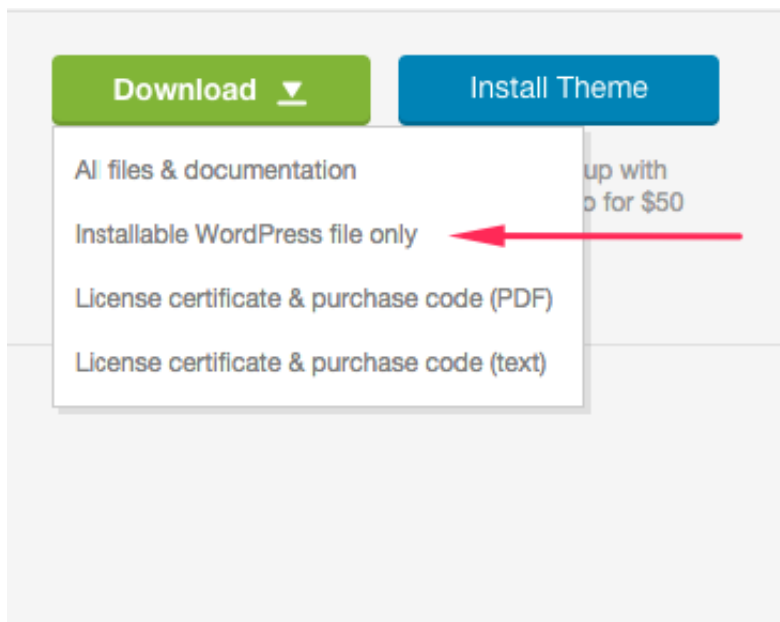
Step 2 - Create a database for WordPress on your web server and a MySQL user with all privileges for accessing and modifying the database.

Step 3 - Upload the WordPress files in the desired location on your web server.

Step 4 - Run the WordPress installation by accessing your website in a web browser.

1.2 Theme Installation via WordPress

In order to download the theme files package, please log in to [Themeforest](https://Themeforest.net). Navigate your mouse over your profile name, then go to the [Downloads](#) page. Click on the Download button and you will get a few options to download: All files & documentation ; Installable WordPress file only ; License certificate & purchase code (PDF) ; License certificate & purchase code (text). Click the **Installable WordPress file only**



When you download the theme from Themeforest, you will get an archive file in .zip extension. When done, you should see *billio.zip*.

Please, follow the steps below to install your Billio Theme.

Step 1 – Login to your WordPress Dashboard.

Step 2 – Go to **Appearance > Themes**. Click **Add New** button, located at the top of the screen.

Step 3 – Continue by clicking **Upload Theme**.

Step 4 – Choose **billio.zip**.

Step 5 – Wait while the theme is uploaded and installed.

Step 6 – Activate the theme and you will be prompted to install required plugins **Visual Composer** and **Revolution Slider**. With few other recommended plugins.

1.3 Common Theme Installation Problems

“Are you sure you want to do this?” If you get the “Are you sure you want to do this” message when installing Billio via WordPress, it means you have an upload file size limit. Install the theme via FTP if this happens, or ask your hosting company to increase the limit.

Missing stylesheet file If you get an error saying that the stylesheet is missing,

then you have uploaded the wrong folder. Please check that you are uploading the billio.zip (billio.zip) within the Theme Files folder. You have to unzip the file that you download from Themeforest Marketplaces to find this.

1.4 Theme Installation via FTP

If you are going to install the theme using FTP, you will need an FTP Client, such as FileZilla.

When you download the theme from Themeforest, you will get an archive file in .zip extension.

When done, you should see *billio.zip*.

Please, follow the steps below to install your Billio Theme via FTP:

Step 1 - Log into your hosting space (server) via FTP client.

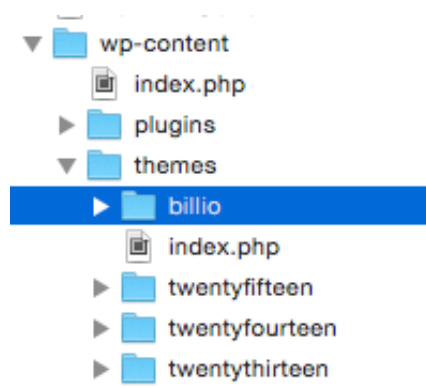
Step 2 - In extracted archive folder, you should see **billio** folder

Step 3 - Upload the **billio** folder to your server in path .../wp-- content/themes/

Step 4 - The uploaded path should look like this: .../wp-content/themes/billio/

Step 5 - Now, login to your WordPress Dashboard and go to Appearance > Themes and activate Billio Theme.

Step 6 - you will be prompted to install required plugins **Visual Composer** and **Revolution Slider**. With few other recommended plugins.



1.5 Setting Up Demo Content

1.5.1 Automatic 1-Click Demo Importer

Setting up the demo content is super easy with our 1-Click Demo Importer. Please, follow the steps below to import the demo data using the 1-Click Demo Importer:

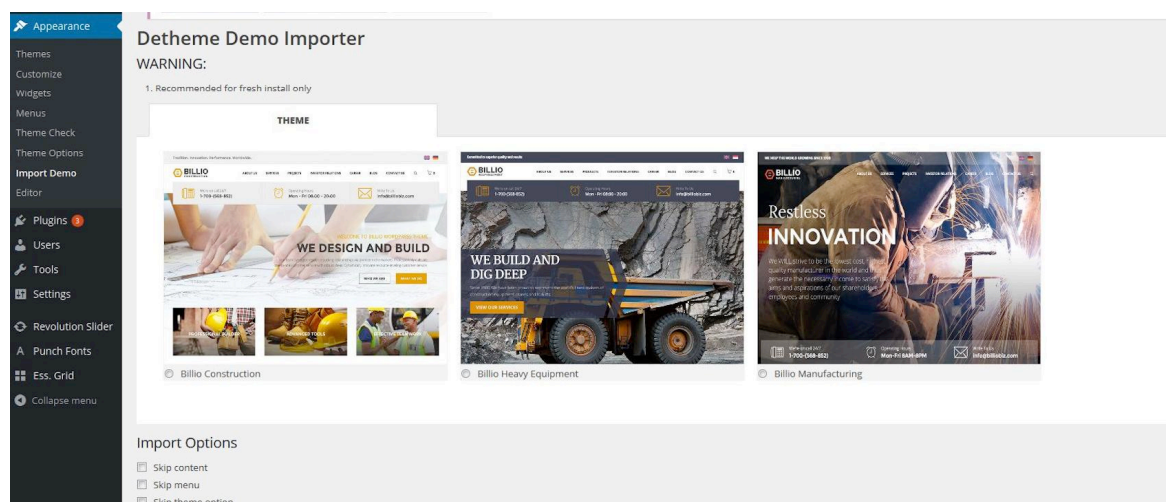
Step 1 – Log into your WordPress Dashboard.

Step 2 – Go to **Appearance > Import Demo**.

Step 3 – Choose a Demo, and scroll down to see more options if you want to skip importing some of demo sections : *Skip Content ; Skip theme option ; Skip Sidebar Widget ; Skip Media ; Skip Slide Demo ; Skip WooCommerce Demo*

Step 4 Click the Import button to start the import process.

Step 5 – Wait until the process is done and the page is reloaded. This may take a while. **Do not interrupt/cancel the import process!**



The importer should be run only once. If something went wrong and you need to import the content again, you may need to reset your WordPress. Use this plugin to reset the WordPress database : <http://wordpress.org/plugins/wordpress-database-reset>

Warning, although importing demo will not remove your existing content. It is highly recommended for new installations only.

1.5.2 Manual Demo Import

Some servers don't support one click import. If you host your site on a sharing server or your server can't handle the import traffic, one click import will fail. In

this case follow these steps to perform manual demo import.

These steps are guidelines for a manual demo import. File names may vary depending on the Demo you are importing.

1.5.2.1 Import Media files, Pages and Posts

Step 1 - From your dashboard click on Tools -> Import -> WordPress and install WordPress Importer.

Step 2 - Click on Activate plugin & run importer.

Step 3 - Click browse and locate **demo_content/ (construction / heavy_equipment / manufacturing)** folder (from zip package previously downloaded from Themeforest). Then choose demo_content.xml

Step 4 - Click **Upload file and import.**

Step 5 - Check **Download and import file attachments.**

Step 6 - Click Submit.

Step 7 - Wait for **All done have Fun! message.**

If you don't get the All done have Fun! message go to Appearance -> Menus delete all the menus and start over again until you get the message.

1.5.2.2 Setup Your Menu

Step 1 - Click on Appearance > Menus.

Step 2 - Switch to Manage Locations tab at the top of the page.

Step 3 - Assign menu **Main Menu** to **Top Navigation**

1.5.5 Setup your Homepage & Blog Page

Step 1 - Click on **Settings > Reading.**

Step 2 - Set **Front page displays > A static page** to Home as displayed below:

1.5.2.3 Theme Options Import

Step 1 - Navigate to Appearance > Theme Options > Import/Export tab.

Step 2 - Open this following file : **demo_content/ (*construction / heavy_equipment / manufacturing*) /theme_option.json**

Step 3 - Copy all of its code into **Theme Options > Export / Import**

Step 4 - Click **Save Changes**

1.5.6 Revolution Slider Import

Step 1 - Click on Revolution Slider tab in your dashboard.

Step 2 - Click on Import Slider button.

Step 3 - Choose your slider file **demo_content/ (*construction / heavy_equipment / manufacturing*)/revslider/slider-...zip**

Step 3 - Hit **Import Slider**

1.5.3.4 Widget Options Import

Step 1 - Click on Plugins > Add New.

Step 2 - Search for **WP Options Importer** plugin by Matthew Boynes or download it manually from here: <https://wordpress.org/plugins/options-importer>

Step 3 - Go to **Tools > Import > Options**.

Step 4 - Select file from previously downloaded zip package from Themeforest : **demo_content/ (construction / heavy_equipment / manufacturing) /widget_option.json**

Step 5 - Click on **Upload File and Import**.

Step 6 - You will be prompted to *What would you like to import?* question, select **All Options**, and tick **Override existing options** for *Additional Settings*

Step 7 - Click on **Import Selected Options**.

1.6 Translating The Theme

Billio is localized and you can easily translate it to any language you like. Please make sure that the font that you are using on your website is supporting your language characters. For example Cyrillic characters.

The theme is already translated to two languages : English and Bahasa. Inside **billio > languages** folder, you will find .po / .mo files for those languages.

1.6.1 Translate to any other language

In order to translate the theme to any other language, follow the steps below:

Step 1 - Duplicate this file `billio/languages/en_us.po` into `wp-content/languages/themes`

Step 2 - Rename it to your language code, with a prefix `detheme-` (for example `detheme-id_ID.po` for Indonesian Language)

Step 3 - Open it using [poedit](https://poedit.net/). Search for string you want to translate into, then save it.

Step 4 - Poeditor will generate **.mo** file. Upload this file into a same folder as **.po** file.

Step 5 - Rename **/billio/languages** directory into something else, for example **lang**, in order to disable this folder from wordpress language indexing.

Step 6 - Once you've done with steps above, navigate to **Settings > General > Site Language**. Select your language from select option.

1.6.2 Send us your translation!

2. First Steps

2.1 Upload your logo image

You can upload your logo image in the Billio Theme Options. If the logo is not uploaded, then Billio logo will be used.

Please, follow the steps below to upload your logo:

Step 1 – Login to your WordPress Dashboard.

Step 2 – Go to Appearance > Theme Options > Main Navigation. Billio has distinct feature that allow you to upload different logo images between homepage and the rest of all pages. And if your **Sticky Menu** option is active, you are

able to set two different logo images, which will be set on default navigation bar and sticky navigation bar.

Step 3 – Upload your logo in any size

*To implement retina logo, please upload your logo resolution exactly double the size you are going to set under **Logo Width** setting*

2.2 Change Post & Custom Post Layout

Billio comes with three layouts: Full, Left Sidebar and Right Sidebar.

Please, follow the steps below to find out how to change your layout:

Step 1 – Login to your WordPress Dashboard.

Step 2 – Go to Appearance > Theme Options > General > General Settings. You will see Main Layout as WP default post, with other type of posts : Recruitments Layout, Reports Layout, WooCommerce, Contact Forms Layout and all other posts

that are installed in your WordPress website.

Step 3 – Choose between Full, Left Sidebar and Right Sidebar.

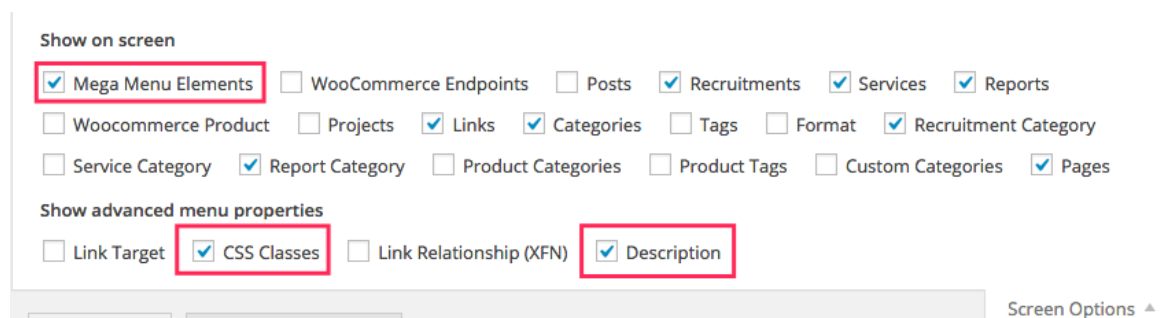
Step 4 – Don't forget to save the changes.

2.3 Mega Menu Setup

The mega menus are available only for top level navigations items only in "Main Menu" area.

Follow the steps below to create a mega menu:

Step 1 – Make sure that **Mega Menu Elements, CSS Classes and Description** option is checked in the **Screen Options** under "Show advanced menu properties" while you are in **Appearance > Menus** page in your WordPress Dashboard.



Step 2 – Now, add a an item to the menu editor. **This has to be a top level item!**

Step 3 – Click on arrow icon in the top right-hand and expand. Tick **Activate Mega Menu Dropdown for this item** checkbox.

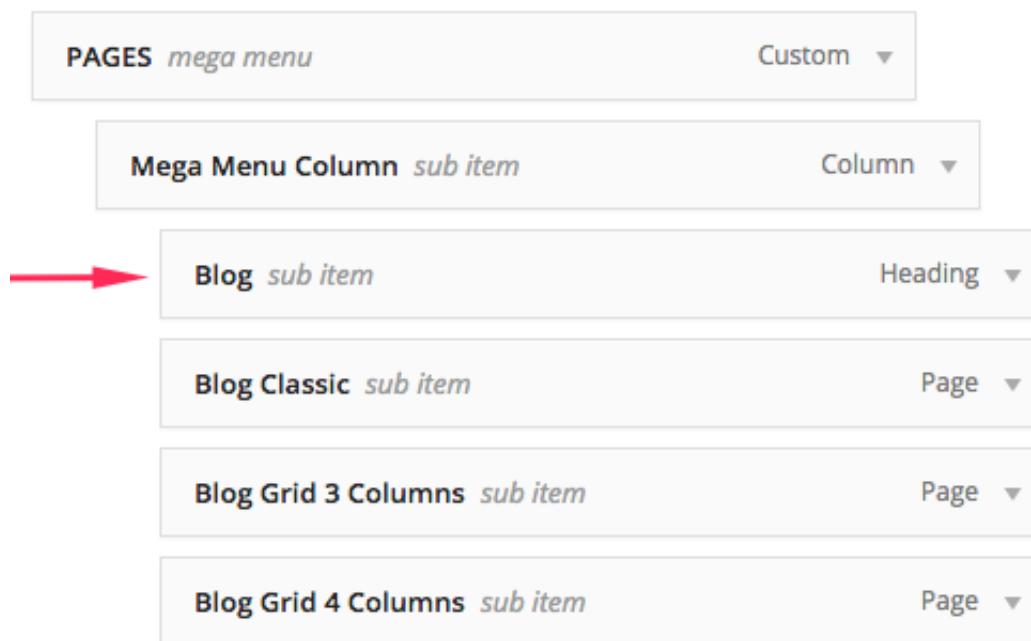

- Step 7 – To add Heading/ Title, click Add Heading Item in Mega Menu Elements and arrange it in the first order.



Step 6 - Your dropdown should now look something like this :

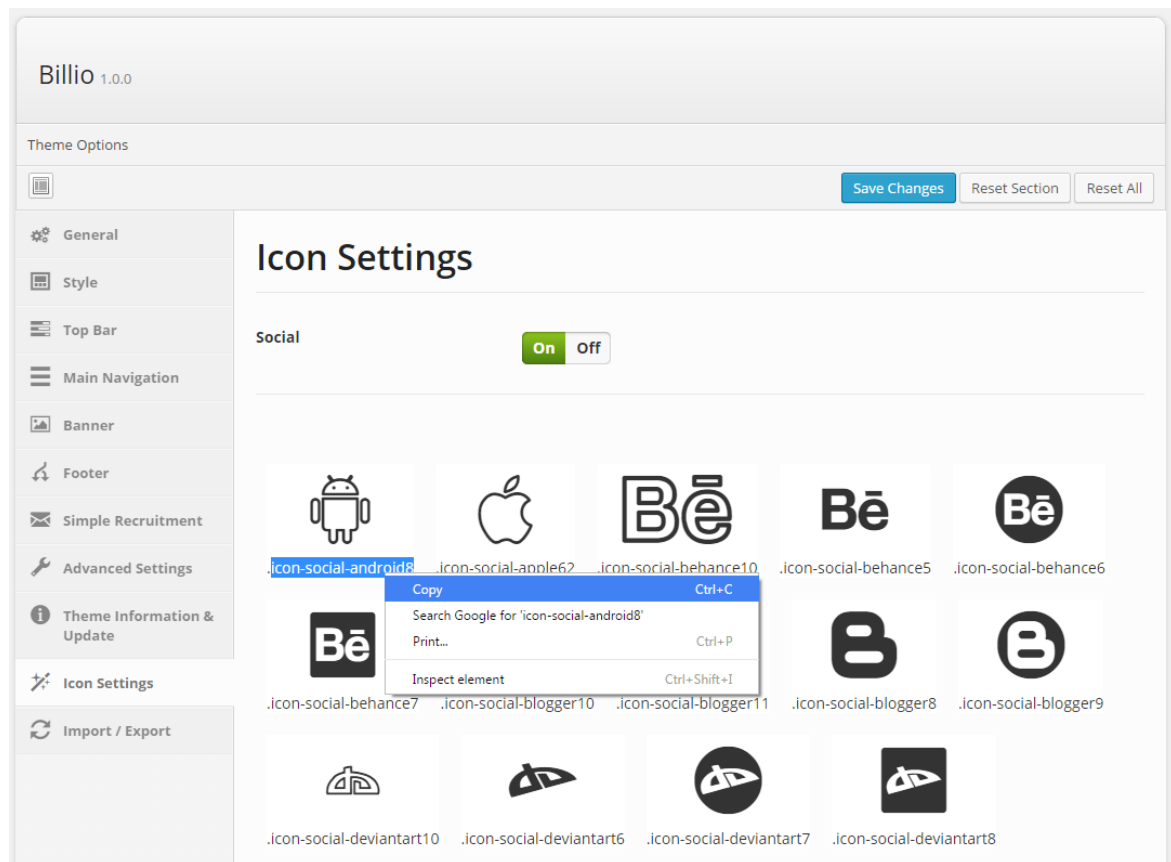
2.4 Icons in Top Bar

Follow the steps below to create an icon menu:

Step 1 - Navigate to **Appearance > Theme Options > Icon Settings**

Step 2 - Browse the icon and select an icon class name. Icon class name will be

displayed on bottom of icon. Copy the icon class name.



Step 3 – Navigate to **Appearance > Menus** then enable **CSS Classes** from **Screen Options** panel (at the top of Menus page) by ticking it.

Step 4 – Create **Links** type menu, enter *URL* and *Link Text*

Step 5 – Enter icon-name copied before in step 2 ; in example **icon-social-android8** (without quotes) into CSS Classes field.

Step 6 – Navigate to **Theme Options > Top Bar Settings > Select Left or Right Section > Type Of Element**, select **Icon from Menu**.

2.5 Create Posts

There are eight custom post types in Billio theme. Standard, Gallery, Image, Quote, Video, Audio, Link and Aside.

Adding Posts

Step 1 – Log in to your WordPress Administration Panel (Dashboard)..

Step 2 – Click the 'Posts' tab.

Step 3 – Click the 'Add New' sub-tab.

Step 4 – Start filling in the blanks: enter your post title in the upper field, and enter your post body content in the main post editing box below it.

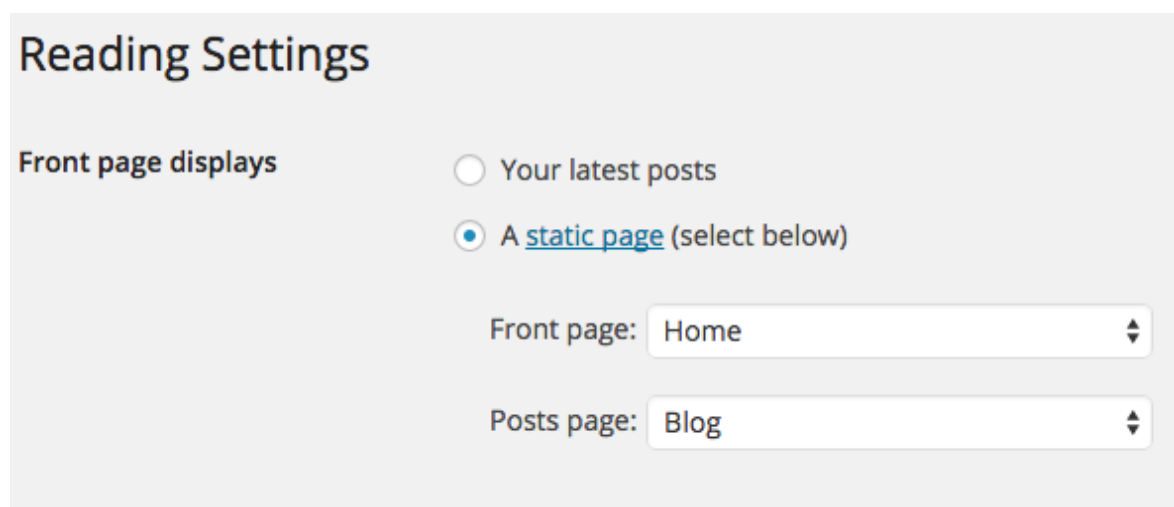
Step 5 – As needed, select a category, add tags, fill in the meta settings below the editor.

Step 6 – Select post format on the right hand side and fill in the meta settings below the editor.

Step 7 – It is important to upload a featured image for your post.

Showing Posts

Simply create a new page, name it as **Blog**, then make sure that you also set the **Posts Page** to Blog under **Appearance > Settings > Readings**.



2.6 Add Service Items

Billio has inbuilt support for Service Custom Post Type. Use it to showcase your services.

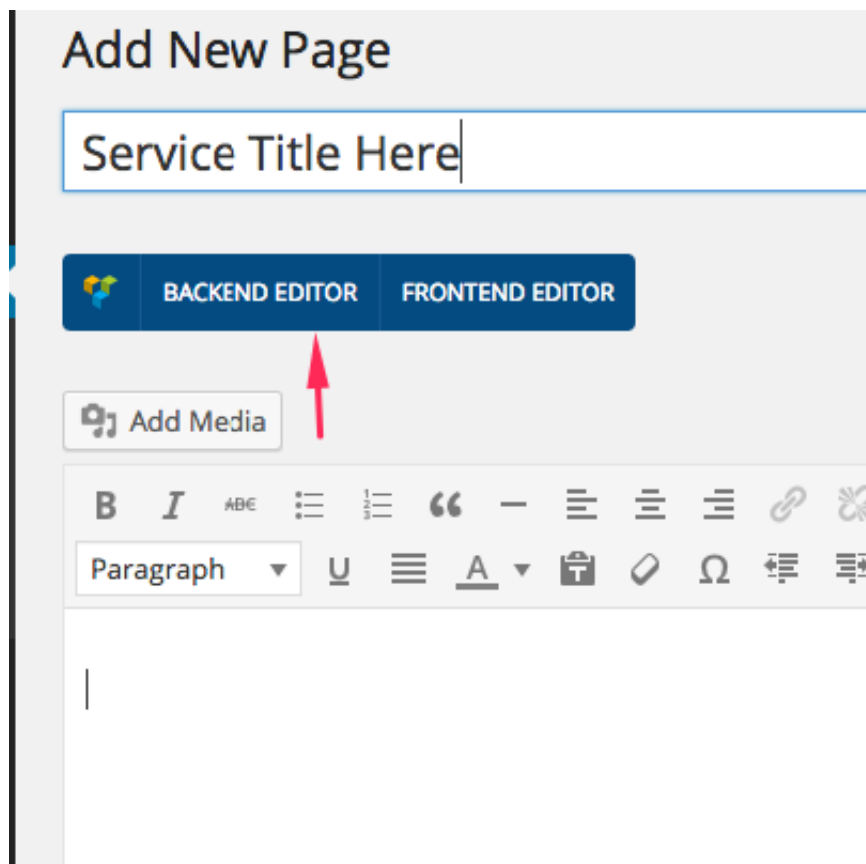
Step 1 - Log in to your WordPress Administration Panel (Dashboard).

Step 2 - Click the *Services* tab.

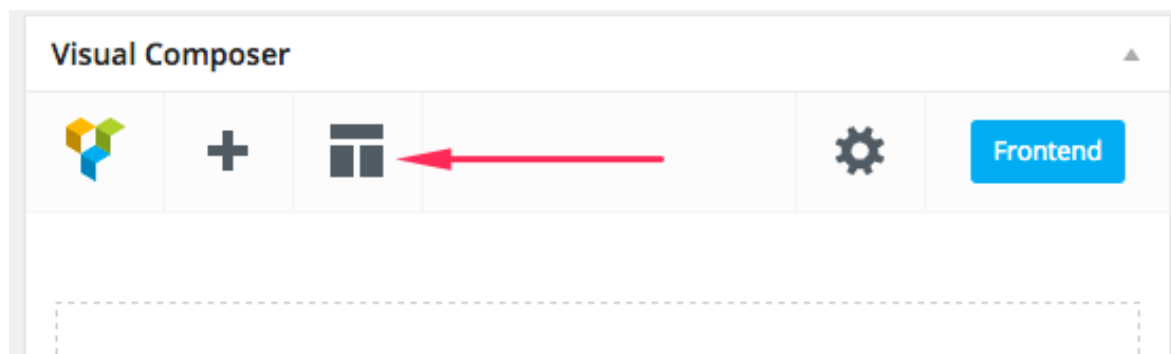
Step 3 - Click the *Add New* sub-tab.

Step 4 - Start filling in the blanks: enter your Service title in the upper field.

Step 5 - Make sure you have Backend Editor mode selected. If you have not, you will see **Backend Editor** button appear under Page Title, then click it.



Step 6 - Click on Templates icon



Step 5 – Select **Service Layout**. It might take a while for your machine to render the layout. Please wait and do not interrupt the process.

Step 6 – Once the layout is loaded. Simply replace texts, titles, and images with your own content.

2.6.1 Showing Services Item

If you have imported 1-Click Demo Import, **All Services** page will be automatically set. If you did not import it, please follow these steps below :

Step 1 – You need to use Essential Grid Plugin in order to list your Service posts. Make sure Essential Grid plugin is installed and activated.

Step 2 – Go to **Dashboard > Ess. Grid > Import / Export**. Click on **Import**, choose Essential Grid demo file under **Demo Content/Essential Grid**, pick one file based on the theme you are working on, then click Import.

Step 3 – Navigate to **Dashboard > Ess. Grid**, click on the Settings (green button) for **All Services**.

Step 4 – Click **Source** tab, select **Post Types** to **Service** and specify **Post Categories**. Leave other settings as is.

Step 5 – Click **Save Grid** green button at top right of the browser window.

Step 6 – Create a new page, select Visual Composer Template named **All Services Layout**.

Step 7 – Add Visual Composer element named **Essential Grid** to the page.

Step 8 – Choose grid to **All Services**, then hit **Add Selected Grid**.

Step 9 – Publish the page.

2.7 Project / Equipment Posts

Both **Project** and **Equipment** posts use Essential Grid Custom Type Post. To access Essential Grid Posts, navigate to this following url : your_domain/wp-admin/edit.php?post_type=essential_grid.

We have modified Essential Grid Custom Type Post to allow user to change its name and its permalink. Go to **Settings** sub tab to configure them.

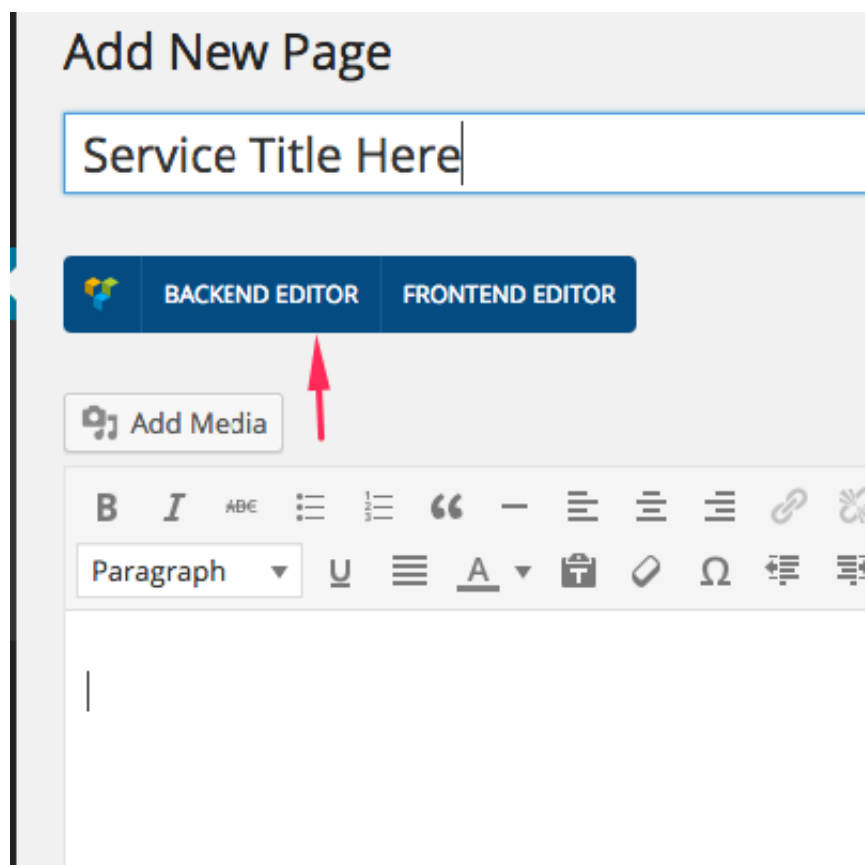
2.7.1 Add Project / Equipment items gallery

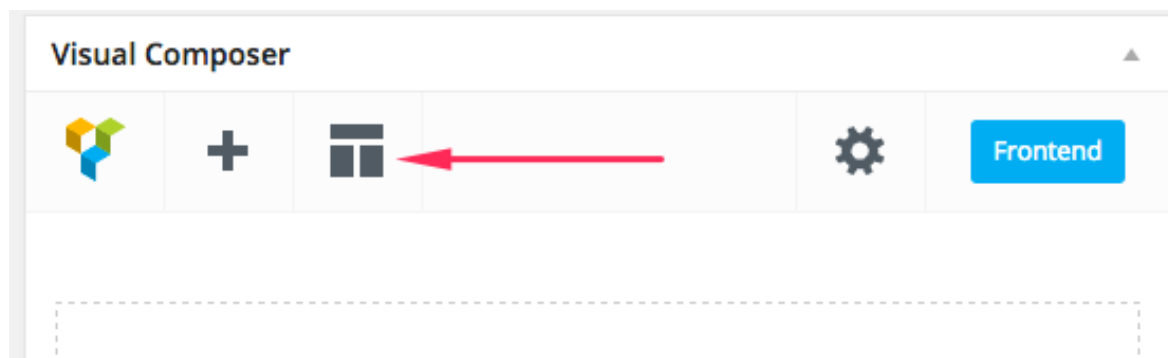
Step 1 - Navigate to this following url : your_domain/wp-admin/edit.php?post_type=essential_grid then click 'Add New' sub tab.

Step 2 - Enter your Project / Equipment title in the upper field.

Step 3 - Make sure you have Backend Editor mode selected. If you have not, you will see **Backend Editor** button appear under Page Title, then click it.



Step 4 - Click on Templates icon



Step 5 – Select **Project Layout (or Equipment Layout)**. It might take a while for your machine to render the layout. Please wait and do not interrupt the process.

Step 6 – Once the layout is loaded. Simply replace texts, titles, and images with your own content.

2.7.2 Showing Project / Equipment items gallery

If you have imported 1-Click Demo Import, **All Services** page will be automatically set. If you did not import it, please follow these steps below :

Step 1 – You need to use Essential Grid Plugin in order to list your Service posts. Make sure Essential Grid plugin is installed and activated.

Step 2 – Go to **Dashboard > Ess. Grid > Import / Export**. Click on **Import**, choose the Essential Grid demo file under **Demo Content/Essential Grid**, pick one file based on the theme you are working on, then click Import.

Step 3 – Navigate to **Dashboard > Ess. Grid**, click on the Settings (green button) for **Projects (or Equipment)**.

Step 4 – Click **Source** tab, select **Post Types** to **Services (or any name Post Types)** and specify the **Post Categories**. Leave other settings as is.

Step 5 – Click **Save Grid** green button at top right of the browser window.

Step 6 – Choose your grid , then hit **Add Selected Grid**.

Step 9 – Publish the page.

2.8 Add Recruitment Post

Billio comes with DT Recruitment plugin. This plugin is used to handle simple recruitment/vacancy information on website.

2.8.1 Simple Recruitment Theme Options

After DT Recruitment plugin installed, you will have additional tab named **Simple Recruitment** on **Theme Options**. Please visit **Appearance > Theme Options > Simple Recruitment** on Wordpress Dashboard.

Step 1 – Set **Job Description Fields**. These custom fields will appear on Recruitment Custom Post.

Step 2 – Set **Email Address**. This email address will be used as target email when visitors submit their application forms. If you using multiple email addresses separate them with comma. Leave it email address blank if you want to use

site's admin email as target email.

Step 3 – Check **Attachment Type**. Select the file type allowed to attach in the application form.

Step 4 – Set **Attachment Size**. Set the maximum attachment file size allowed to attach in the application form in KiloByte.

Step 5 – Set **Application Form Heading Text**. This heading text will appear on application Form.

Step 6 – Set **Email to Friend Form Heading Text**. This heading text will appear "Email to Friend" Form.

Step 7 – Set **Confirmation Message**. This Message will appear when the application has been successfully sent.

2.8.2 Create a Recruitment post

Follow the steps below to create a recruitment post :

Step 1 – Navigate to **Recruitment > Add New** menu.

Step 2 – Enter the title, description, career job fields and choose or create recruitment category.

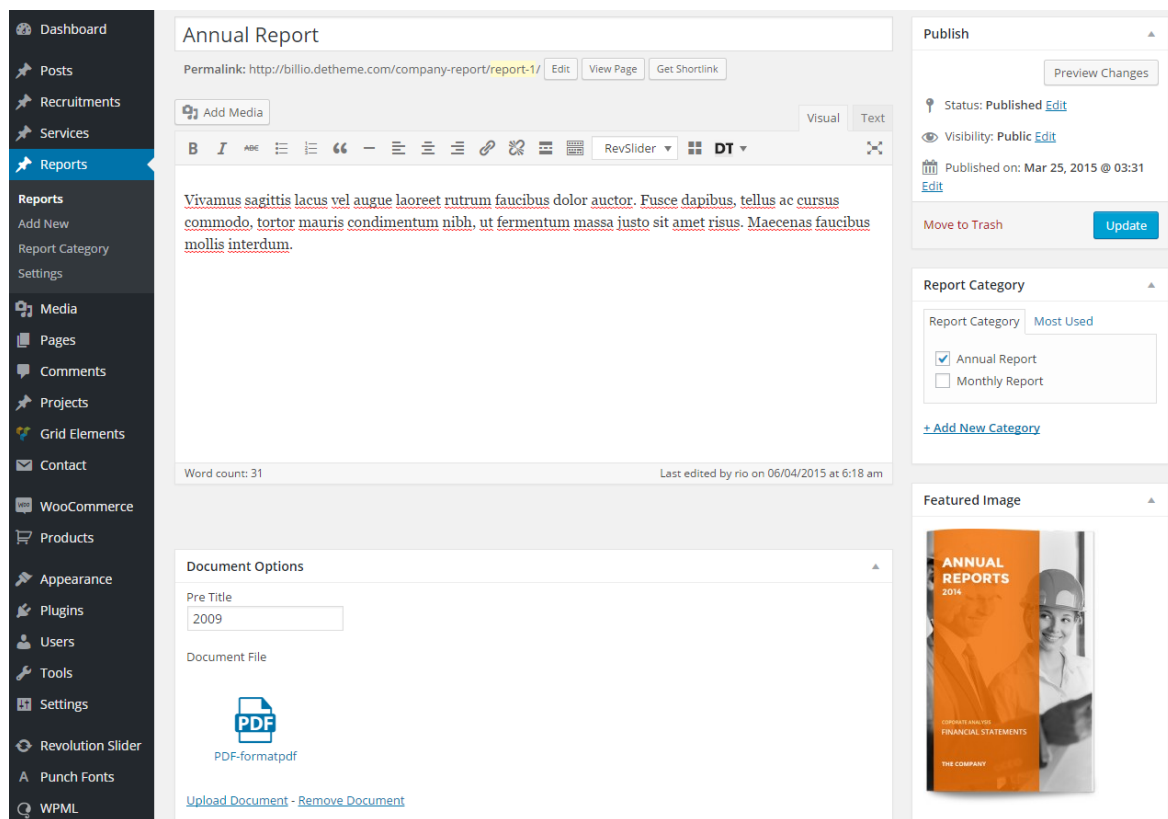

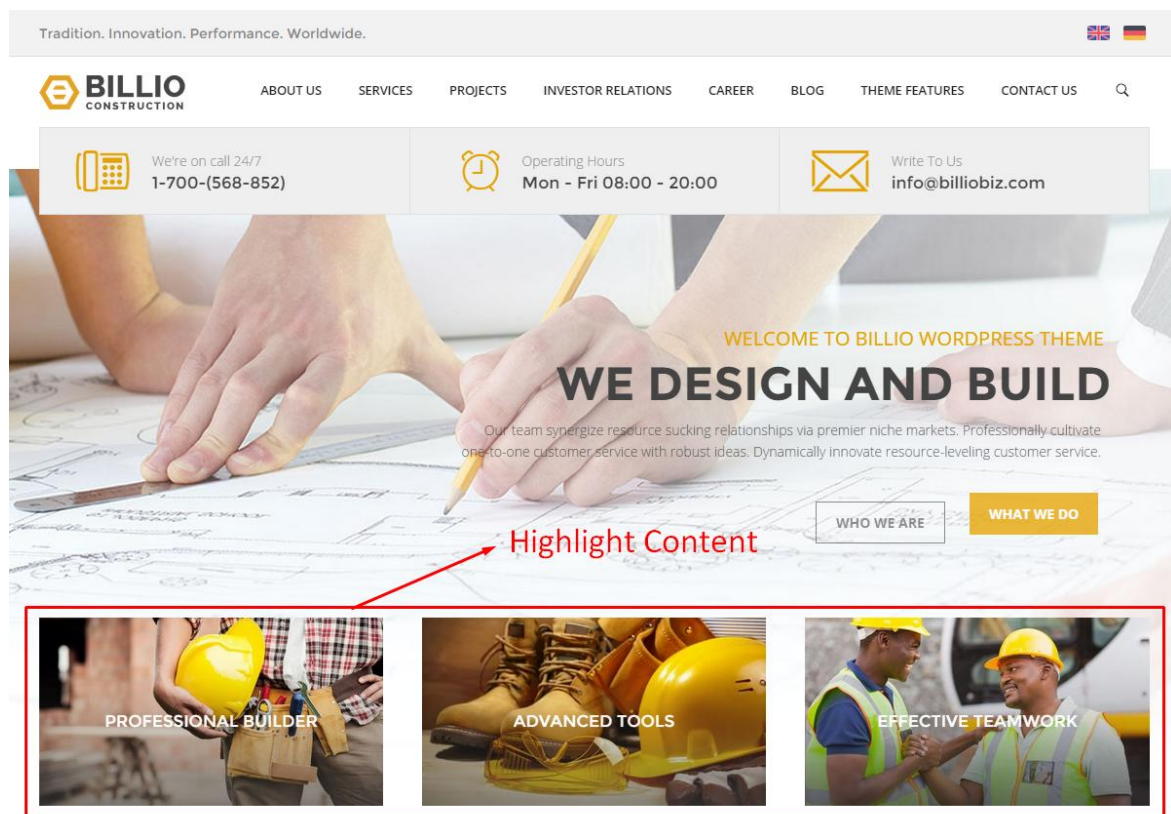

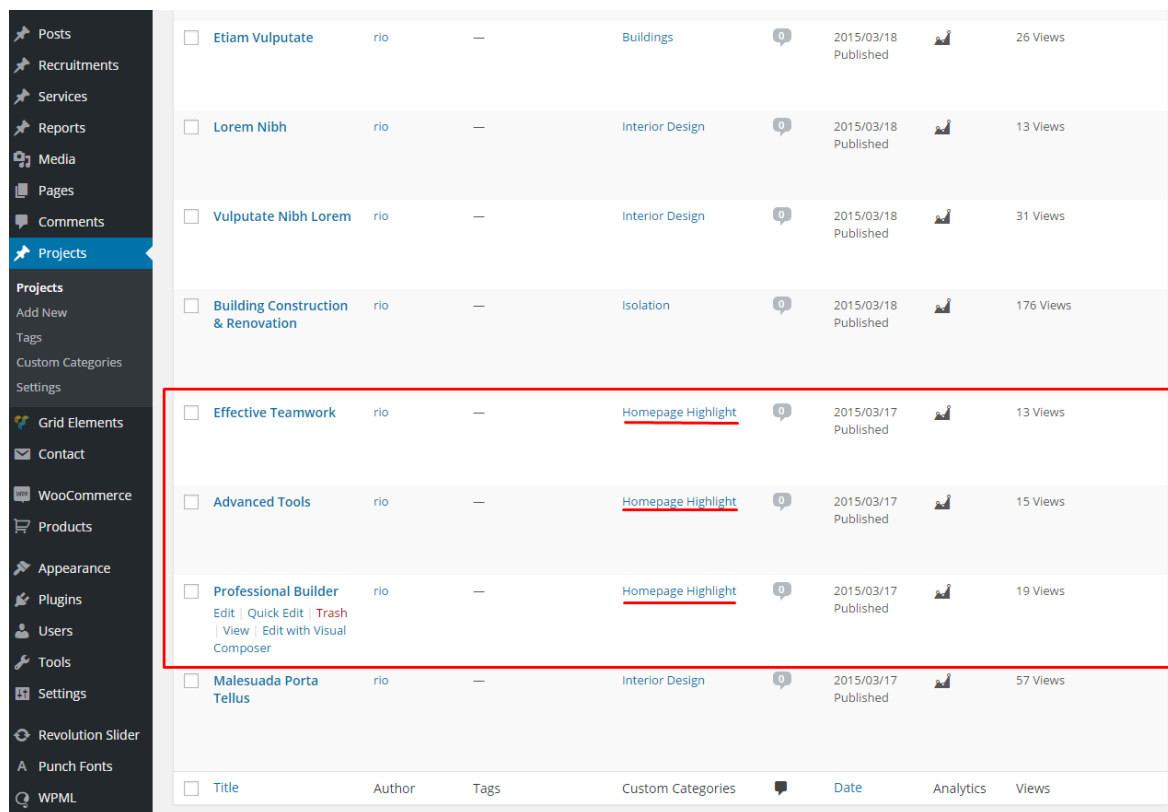
2.11 Replace Highlight Content & Image

Step 2 – Edit posts that has **Homepage Highlight** Category.

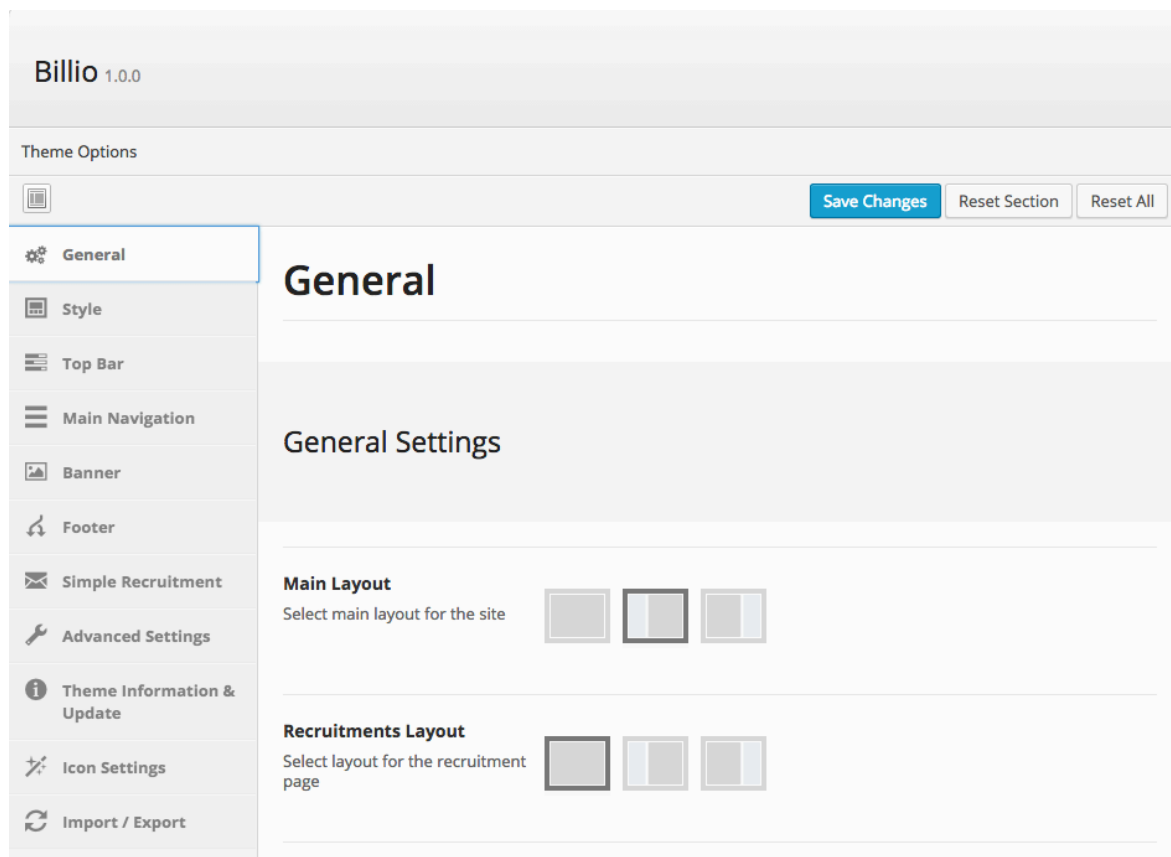

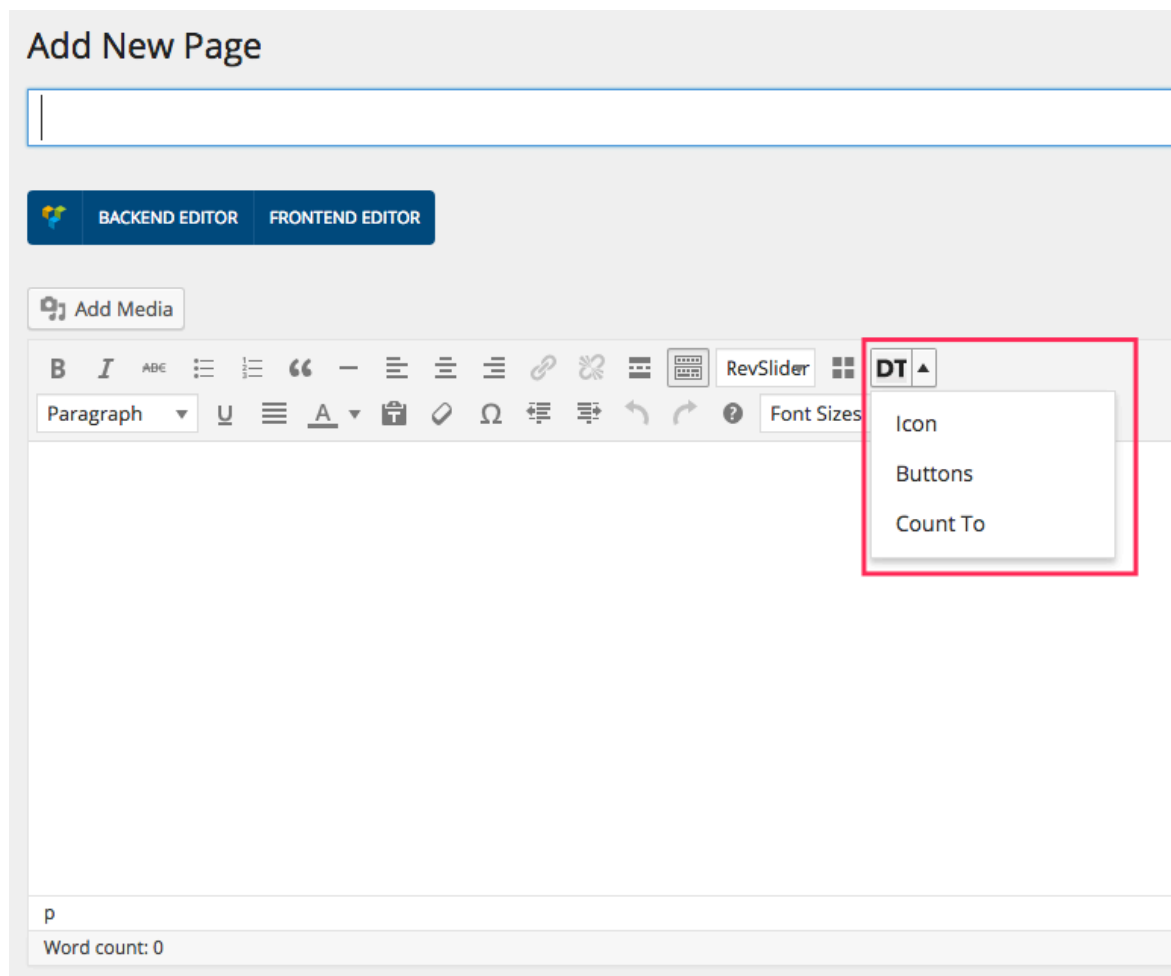

Included Page Templates:


- Default Template

Default template The Default Template offers a standard layout of the page, but still presented in a beautiful way, completely blending in with the rest of the theme. The Default template has option to set sidebar position.

Blank Template This is a simple and minimalistic template. Header and Footer are both disabled on this template which allows you to create gorgeous Landing, Coming Soon, Maintenance Pages or 404 page.

Fullwidth If you choose this template, the content of the page will be displayed full width with no margin from the edge of the browser window. Usually this template is used as homepage.

Woocommerce Page Woocommerce Page Template only available if you have installed WooCommerce Plugin in your WordPress. Woocommerce Page Template looks like Default Template. The difference is Woocommerce Page Template will display Shop Sidebar Widget Area as Sidebar. The Woocommerce Page template has option to set sidebar position.

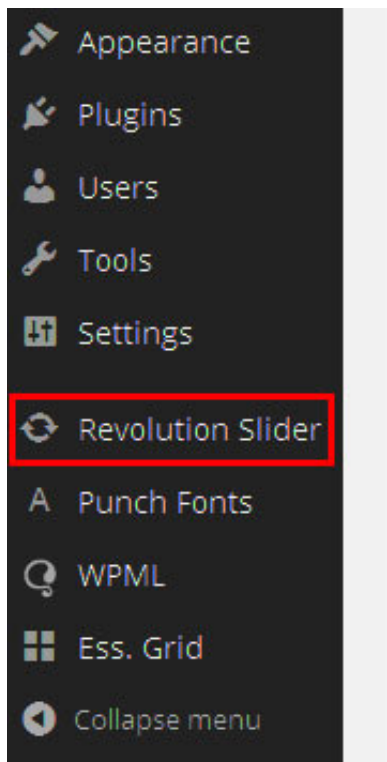



4. How To's

4.1. Set up One Page

You can create One Page Site with Billio Theme. You do not have to create multiple pages in order to generate the One Page Site, you need to create only one and simply add extra id to row in your page. This is a neat way to put all

content on one page and the navigation will scroll directly to the according page section. Like a complete website, with all information on one page. Generating the page is simple as is the custom menu construction.

Generate One Page Sections

Step 1 – Navigate to **Pages > Add New** and fill in the page title.

Step 2 – Add **Row Visual Composer Element** and fill the row with Content.

Step 3 – Edit Row Settings by clicking **pencil icon** then fill **Extra id** field with a

value for example 'section-1'

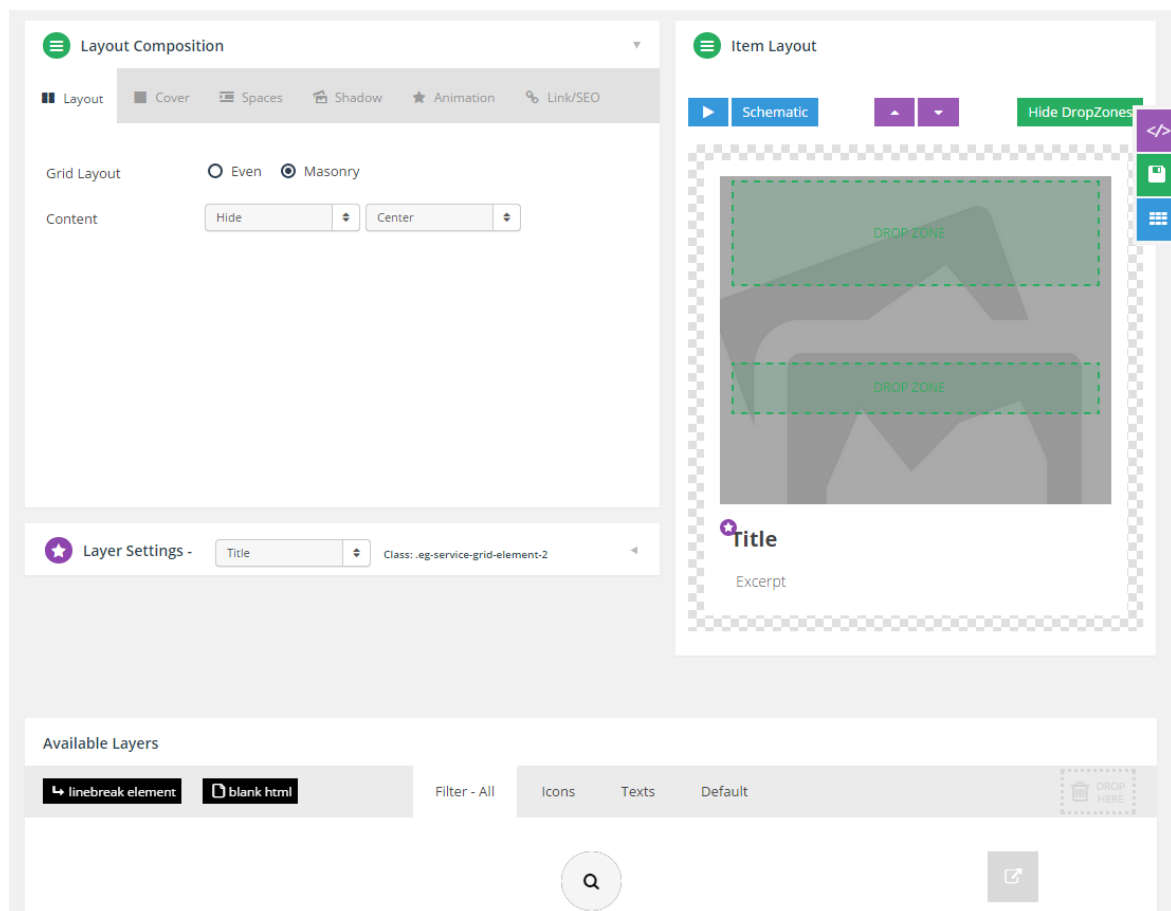
How To Use Essential Grid

From the **widgets panel** drag the "Essential Grid" widget to the desired sidebar

There are 4 boxes on Skin Editor i.e. **Item Layout**, **Layout Composition**, **Layer Settings** and **Available Layers**.



4.6.1 Item Layout

Item Layout box is a place to arrange and to preview the skin. You could drag and drop layers from **Available Layers** box into Item layout. You could select a layer on item layout to edit the layer setting on **Layer Settings** box.

You also could preview the skin by clicking play button.

4.6.2 Layout Composition

Layout Composition box is a place to arrange layout setting of the skin. There are 4 tabs in this box i.e. Layout, Cover, Spaces, Shadow, Animation and Link/SEO.

4.6.3 Layer Settings

Layer Settings box is a place to arrange layer setting. This box will be automatically opened while a layer on Item layout is selected. There are 4 tabs in this box i.e. Source, Style, Show/Hide, Animation and Link/SEO.

4.6.4 Available Layers

Available Layers box contains available icon layers, text layers and line break that could be dragged and dropped into Item Layout.

4.7. Hide comment form

It's easy to hide comment form with Billio Theme. Navigate to **Appearance > Theme Options > General**, scroll window to the bottom until you find **Comments Section**.

Under **Comments Section** there are options to turn on/off comments on posts, pages, services, reports, and projects.

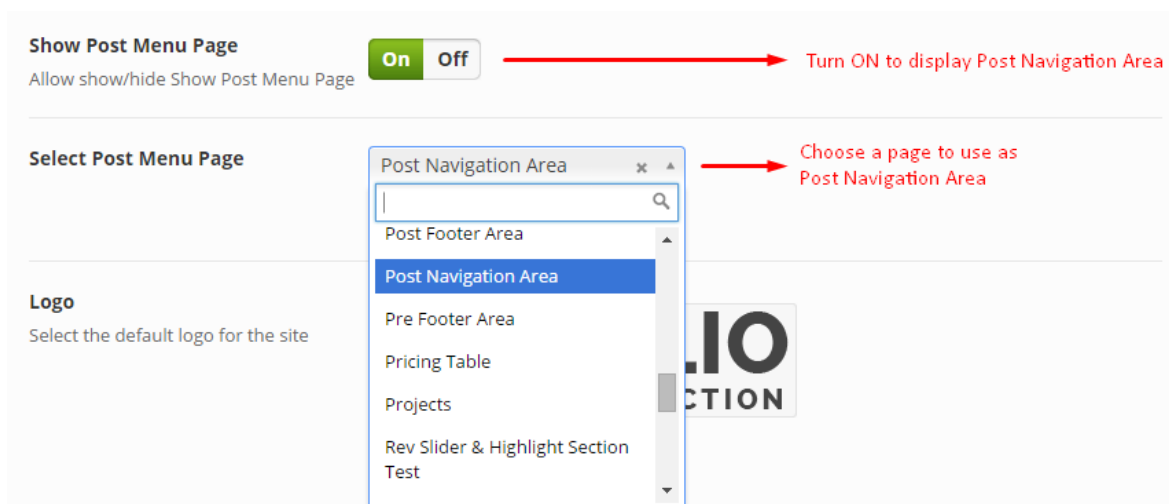
